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this teacher's book is the companion to academic presenting and presentations isbn 978 3 7347 8367 8 a training course designed to help students cultivate academic presentation skills and deal with the various presentation tasks they may be required to fulfil during the course of their university studies the material is suitable for a global audience and can be used in a wide range of contexts in the fields of communication skills english language teaching and english for academic purposes in addition to providing valuable notes on each unit the teacher's book contains key information on the underlying principles concept and structure of the course and sets out the rationale behind its design teachers and through them their students can benefit from the depth of the insights presented here making the classroom experience a rewarding and enjoyable one academic presentations can be particularly challenging for non native english speakers and consequently the print material and the accompanying video recordings dovetail neatly to provide linguistic support and guidance as well as enhancing presentation skills and providing a forum for practice feedback and ongoing improvement however broader topics of interest appropriate to a study oriented context such as research and plagiarism are also dealt with in a unique balance of content that goes beyond the treatment of discrete language points and emphasises high level task achievement whilst at the same time focusing attention on the specific requirements of addressing an audience in an academic environment

this book is for university students with at least a mid intermediate level of english it can be used as part of an english for academic purposes eap course either alone or with the companion volume writing an academic paper in english the chapters are independent so that eap teachers and students can choose those sections that best fit their needs this means that a course could range from a minimum of 20 hours up to 60 hours or more there is an introductory chapter that includes what role academics play in today's world where success is not just measured in terms of paper output and presentations at conferences but also in involvement interdisciplinary projects and supporting society at large each chapter covers either a particular skill e.g. preparing a script pronunciation visuals how to begin and end a presentation or the particular purpose of a specific moment in a presentation for example the final slide is designed not just to conclude and thank the audience but is an opportunity to reach out for collaborations and assistance the aims of each part of a presentation are also highlighted by comparisons with non academic situations where similar skills are required the course is highly practical with screenshots from real presentations given by phd students it is also designed to be fun to use other books in the series writing an academic paper in english essential english grammar and communication strategies adrian wallwork is the author of more than 40 elt and eap textbooks he has trained several thousand phd students and researchers from around 50 countries to write research papers and give presentations he is also the co founder of e4ac.com an editing agency for non native english speaking researchers

this book discusses and demonstrates the types of english discourse used at academic conferences and offers guidance to prospective conference participants from multiple perspectives it is a combination of research taken from numerous academic conferences attended and observations made by the author based on well established research methods in applied linguistics as well as a guidebook aimed at students esp teachers and young academics and professionals wishing to upgrade their skills to participate fruitfully in and contribute to academic conferences it offers academic novices and non native speakers of english in particular much that is new and practical far beyond the realm of simple presentation tips it addresses various topics such as chairing discussions poster management discussion sessions the ted phenomenon workshops and the emerging field of english as a lingua franca the style alternates between the accessible and practical and the analysis of the linguistic categories underpinning the discourse genre analysis the nature of the specialist discourse community features of academic spoken discourse and the presentation as multimodal narrative are all explored the book includes authentic samples of model speech discourse throughout along with questions and exercises for deliberation or practice in each chapter
